About this guide

This user manual provides guidelines and protocols to use the RNAscope® 2.5 LSx Reagent Kit for use with Leica Biosystems' BOND RX Research Advanced Staining System. RNAscope® 2.5 LSx Assays are compatible with a variety of sample types.

Product description

Background

The RNAscope® 2.5 LSx Assays use a novel and proprietary method of *in situ* hybridization (ISH) to visualize single RNA molecules per cell in formalin-fixed, paraffin-embedded (FFPE) tissue mounted on slides. The assays are based on Advanced Cell Diagnostic's patented signal amplification and background suppression technology, and can detect RNA molecules in archival samples and partially degraded specimens. The RNAscope® 2.5 LSx Assay allows users to automate the highly sensitive RNAscope® Assay using Leica Biosystems' BOND RX System.

Overview

Figure 1 on page Error! Bookmark not defined. illustrates the RNAscope® 2.5 LSx Assay procedure, which takes ~9–10 hours. You will first pretreat sections, and then hybridize RNA-specific probes to target RNA. The signal is then amplified using multiple steps, followed by hybridization to alkaline phosphatase (AP)-labeled probes and detection using Fast Red. A single RNA transcript will appear as a distinct dot of chromogen precipitate that is visible using a common bright-field microscope.

3: Amplify signal

1: Tissue section	2: Hybridize to target RNA
Start with properly prepared sections and load slides onto the instrument. Pretreat tissue to allow access to target RNA.	Hybridize gene-specific probe pairs to the target mRNA.

Hybridize probe to a cascade of signal amplification molecules, culminating in binding of AP-labeled probes. Add Fast Red substrate to detect target RNA.

Visualize target RNA using a standard bright field microscope.

Kit contents and storage

The RNAscope® 2.5 LSx Assay requires the RNAscope® 2.5 LS Probes and the RNAscope® 2.5 LSx Reagents, available from Advanced Cell Diagnostics.

RNAscope® 2.5 LS Probes

The RNAscope® 2.5 LS Probes consist of the user-specified Target Probe and the Positive and Negative Control Probes. Visit https://acdbio.com/products to find a gene-specific Target Probe or appropriate Control Probes. Each bottle contains enough probe to stain ~30 standard slides. The probes have a shelf life of two years from the manufacturing date when stored as indicated in the following table:

RNAscope® 2.5 LSx Reagents

The RNAscope® 2.5 LSx Reagent Kit – RED (Cat. No. 322750) contains the reagents required to run the RNAscope® 2.5 LSx Assay on Leica Biosystems' BOND RX System, except for the RNA-specific probes. The kits provide enough reagents to stain ~60 standard slides.

The reagents are Ready-To-Use (RTU), and arrive in labeled Leica BOND compatible containers in two trays. Use the two trays in parallel as a single kit. The first tray has two tray barcodes and a label on the handle, and contains the LS Rinse, Fast Red chromogen, and counterstaining reagents. Register the reagents on this tray as a set using the tray barcodes. Do not remove or change the position of the reagents in the tray. Removing or changing the position of the containers will result in run failure.

The second tray contains the pretreatment and signal amplification reagents. The reagents on this tray need to be individually registered.

Note: You can use the empty spots on the trays for BOND Open containers, such as those containing custom probes.

Do not substitute the reagent components of the RNAscope® 2.5 LSx Reagent Kit with those of other RNAscope® Reagent Kits, including RNAscope® 2.0 or 2.5 LS Reagent Kits, even if the components have the same name. Do not refill prefilled containers as the barcodes correlate to the volumes in the container. Do not mix trays between different RNAscope® 2.5 LSx Kits or other RNAscope® Reagent Kits.

Chapter 2. Before You Begin

Prior to running the RNAscope® 2.5 LSx Assay on your samples for the first time, we recommend that you:

- Become familiar with Leica Biosystems' BOND RX Research Advanced Staining System. Refer to the Leica Biosystems' BOND RX System Instructions For Use.
- Run the assay on RNAscope[®] Control Slides (Cat. No. 310045 for Human HeLa Cell Pellet, and Cat. No. 310023 for Mouse 3T3 Cell Pellet) using the RNAscope[®] 2.5 LS Positive and Negative Control Probes.

Important procedural guidelines

- Start with properly fixed and prepared sections. Refer to **Chapter 3. Prepare and Pretreat Samples** on page 10 for preparation of FFPE slides. For preparation of other sample types, contact **support@acdbio.com**.
- Regularly maintain and clean your automated staining instrument.
- Always run positive and negative control probes on your sample to assess sample RNA quality and optimal permeabilization.
- Do not substitute required materials. The assay has been validated with these materials only.
- Follow the protocol exactly for best results.
- Do not let your sections dry out during the procedure.
- Use good laboratory practices and follow all necessary safety procedures. Refer to **Appendix E. Safety** page 39 for more information.





Chapter 3. Prepare and Pretreat Samples

The following protocols describe formalin-fixed, paraffin-embedded (FFPE) sample preparation and pretreatment.

IMPORTANT! We highly recommend following these guidelines. We cannot guarantee assay results with other preparation methods.

Prepare FFPE sections

Materials required

Fix the sample

- 10% neutral buffered formalin (NBF)
- 1X PBS
- Paraffin wax
- 95% Ethanol (EtOH)
- Xylene
- Microtome
- Water bath
- SuperFrost® Plus slides
- 1. Immediately following dissection, fix tissue in 10% NBF for **16–32 HRS** at **ROOM TEMPERATURE (RT)**. Fixation time will vary depending on tissue type and size.



CAUTION! Handle biological specimens appropriately.

IMPORTANT!

Fixation for <16 HRS or >32 HRS will impair the performance of the RNAscope® 2.5 LS Assay.

Dehydrate, embed, and cut the sample

IMPORTANT!

Use fresh reagents.


- 1. Wash sample with 1X PBS.
- 2. Dehydrate sample using a standard ethanol series, followed by xylene.
- 3. Embed sample in paraffin using standard procedures.

Note: Embedded samples may be stored at room temperature with desiccation. To better preserve RNA quality over a long period (>1 yr), we recommend storing the slides at $2-8^{\circ}$ C with desiccation.

4. Trim paraffin blocks as needed, and cut embedded tissue into $5 + /- 1 \mu m$ sections using a microtome.



5. Place paraffin ribbon in a **40–45°C** water bath, and mount sections on **SUPERFROST® PLUS SLIDES**. Place tissue as shown for optimal staining:



Tissue section location

IMPORTANT! Do not mount more than one section per slide. Place sections in the center of the slide.

6. Air dry slides **OVERNIGHT** at **RT**.

OPTIONAL STOPPING POINT. Use sectioned tissue within three months. Store sections with dessicants at room temperature.





Chapter 4. Set Up the BDZ 15/BXD 15 Software

IMPORTANT! We strongly recommend you run the RNAscope® Control Slides (Cat. No. 310045 or Cat. No. 310023) using the RNAscope® 2.5 LS positive and negative control probes along with your samples in every run.





Verify the software version

Prior to running the RNAscope® 2.5 LSx Red Assay, you must update the BDZ/BXD software to database version 15. Please contact a Leica field service scientist for help with installing the software update.








Register the LSx reagents


You must register the two trays contained in the RNAscope® 2.5 LSx Red Kit prior to use. The first tray contains the LS rinse, Fast Red chromogen, and counterstaining reagents, and has the label "RNAscope 2.5 LSx Reagent Kit-RED" on the handle. The second tray contains the pretreatment and amplification reagents.

- Register the reagents on the first tray by scanning the two tray barcodes sequentially with the Barcode Scanner.
- 2. After reviewing the scanned information, select **OK**.

Note: You do not need to register the reagents on the tray individually. The tray barcodes contain all of the required information.



- 3. **Register each component separately** on the second tray by scanning the barcode on each reagent container with the Barcode Scanner.
- 4. Select OK.
- 5. Repeat steps 3-4 for all of the reagents on second tray.






Change the status of the LSx protocols

The BDZ/BDX 15 software update includes specific RNAscope® 2.5 LSx Red pretreatment (HIER/protease), hybridization, and staining protocols specifically designed for the RNAscope® 2.5 LSx Red Kit. Prior to registering the probes or setting up a study, you must change the status of the LSx protocols to **Preferred**.


Change the status of the LSx heat pretreatment protocols

1. Select the **Protocol Setup** icon at the top of the screen.






- 2. On the bottom of the screen, select **Prestaining** under the Protocol group menu, **Heat pretreatment** under the Protocol type menu, and **All** under the Preferred status menu.
- 3. Open the *RNAscope 2.5 LSx Target Retrieval (95) protocol.



- 4. On the bottom of the screen, select **Preferred**.
- Select Save.




6. Repeat steps 2-5 for the *RNAscope 2.5 LSx Target Retrieval (88) protocol.




Change the status of the LSx enzyme protocol

- 1. Select the **Protocol Setup** icon at the top of the screen.
- 2. On the bottom of the screen, select **Prestaining** under the Protocol group menu, **Enzyme pretreatment** under the Protocol type menu, and **All** under the Preferred status menu.
- 3. Open the*RNAscope 2.5 LSx Enzyme protocol.



4. On the bottom of the screen, select **Preferred**.






Change the status of the LSx hybridization protocol

- 1. Select the **Protocol Setup** icon at the top of the screen
- 2. On the bottom of the screen, select **Prestaining** under the Protocol group menu, **ISH hybridization** under the Protocol type menu, and **All** under the Preferred status menu.
- 3. Open the *RNAscope 2.5 LSx Hybridization protocol



4. On the bottom of the screen, select **Preferred**.






Change the status of LSx Red Staining Protocol

- 1. Select the **Protocol Setup** icon at the top of the screen.
- On the bottom of the screen, select Staining under the Protocol group menu, ISH detection under the Protocol type menu, and All under the Preferred status menu.
- 3. Open the *RNAscope 2.5 LSx RED ISH protocol.



4. On the bottom of the screen, select Preferred.




Register probes

Database version BDZ 11 required work around steps to accommodate the RNAscope® 2.5 LS Red Assay. These steps included the probe as an ancillary reagent to the staining protocol, and created a mock probe hybridization step. For database version BDZ 15/BXD 15, each probe is registered as a "probe" that is used as a marker for the ISH procedure. The staining protocol no longer contains the probe and starts from the AMP 1 step. A mock probe is no longer required to set up the assay.

Your ACD Field Application Specialist (FAS) will assist you with this procedure.

1. Select the **Reagent Setup** icon at the top of the screen.




2. Select Add to enter reagent information.



3. To create a probe, enter a name (for example, **probe 1**) in the Name text box.

Note: Probe names must be different from the names used for **Ancillary** probes created for the 2.5 LS workaround protocols used in software version BDZ 11.




- 4. Enter **Probe 1** (for example) in the Abbreviated name text box.
- 5. Select **Probe** in the Type drop down menu for software version 4.0. Select **Probe RNA** in the Type drop down menu for software version 5.2.
- 6. Enter **ACD** in the Supplier text box.
- 7. For software version 4.0, select RNA for Probe Type.
- 8. Select the default protocols for the probe you are registering. These are the most commonly used protocols.
- 9. Select Hazardous.
- 10. Select Save.

Note: Perform these steps only once for each target probe.




Set up a study

1. To build a study, select the **Slide setup** icon at the top of the screen.




2. Select **Add study** and enter a name in the **Study ID** field (keep the Dispense volume default as shown at **150** µL).



- 3. Select *Bake and Dewax as the Preparation protocol.
- Select **OK**
- 5. Select Add slide to assign a protocol to each slide.






6. Enter the tissue type and/or probe name under the Comments field.



7. In the Research tab, select **ISH** under Process, and the registered probe name from the Marker drop down menu.



- 8. For RNAscope® 2.5 LSx assays, under the **Protocols** tab:
 - a. Select RNAscope 2.5 LSx RED ISH protocol from the Staining drop down menu.
 - b. For standard FFPE tissues, select the protocol *Bake and Dewax from the Preparation drop down menu.
 - Select *RNAscope 2.5 LSx Target Retrieval (95) as the standard HIER protocol, or RNAscope 2.5 LSx Target Retrieval (88) if using mild conditions.
 - d. Select *RNAscope 2.5 LSx Enzyme for Enzyme.
 - e. Select *RNAscope 2.5 LSx Hybridization for Hybridization.
- 9. Select Add slide for each target probe, and for each of the slides used for the run.
- 10. After adding all the slides to the study, select Close to return to the Slide setup screen.
- 11. Select **Print labels** to print barcodes to attach to the slides.



Prepare the instrument

1. Fill the large containers located in the bottom of the instrument with the Leica BOND RX bulk reagents. Dilute BOND Wash Solution 1:10.

Note: Insufficient bulk reagent volumes may lead to run failure.

IMPORTANT! Do not introduce bubbles into the solutions by shaking the containers. To mix reagents, gently invert the containers several times. If bubbles are present, leave the containers out at room temperature until the bubbles dissipate.

- 2. Use clean, dry covertiles for every run. Clean used covertiles with water, bleach, and ethanol. Air dry before reuse.
- 3. Before starting a run, empty bulk waste containers. Discard waste according to all local, state/provincial, and/or national regulations.

Prepare the instrument reagents

- Use the Barcode Scanner to scan both tray barcodes on the labeled tray. A window will appear on the instrument containing the name and information of the detection system, including the configurations of all the reagents on the tray.
- 2. Select OK.
- 3. For the reagents in the second tray, use the Barcode Scanner to scan the barcode on the front of each container. A window will appear on the instrument containing the name and information for each reagent.
- 4. Select **OK**.



- 5. Empty each target probe into a new 30mL Open container.
- 6. Use the Barcode Scanner to scan the barcode on the front of the 30mL Open container.
- 7. From the drop down menu, select the corresponding name of the probe.
- 8. Enter the probe lot number and the expiration date in their respective fields. Select **OK**.

Start the run

1. Attach the barcodes to the slides, and add the slides to the slide tray with the label sides facing up.

Note: Add a covertile on top of each slide. The rectangular-shaped neck of the covertile should fit into the groove of the slide tray. Verify the placement and seating of the covertile.

- 2. Place the tray in the Leica BOND RX™ and press the button to load the tray onto the machine.
- After scanning the slides, select the PLAY (triangular) button on the screen located under the start tray to start the run. You may also right-click on the scanned label images, and select Delayed Start to start the run at a future time.

IMPORTANT! Before leaving the instrument unattended, ensure that the instrument is running successfully. In the event of a problem, please refer to **Troubleshooting** on page 29.

Note: You may also use an automated coverslipper in the following sections.

Complete the run

- 1. After the run is complete, press the button on the front of the instrument to unload the slides.
- 2. Place the slides onto the Tissue-Tek® Slide Rack, and move the rack into a staining dish containing distilled water.
- 3. Flush the slides with flowing tap water for a few minutes.
- 4. (Optional) Perform offline bluing of choice for 1-2min followed by rinsing
- 5. Wash the slides by lifting the slide rack up and down several times.

Dry and mount the samples

1. Remove the slide rack from the staining dish and dry slides in a 60°C dry oven for 30 MIN.

IMPORTANT! The RED substrate is alcohol sensitive. Do not dehydrate the slides in alcohol.

- 2. Cool the slides for 5 MIN at RT.
- 3. Briefly dip one slide into fresh pure xylene and *immediately* place 1–2 drops of EcoMount on the slide before the xylene dries.

IMPORTANT! Use EcoMount (Biocare Medical) or PERTEX® mounting media.

- 4. Carefully place 24 mm x 50 mm coverslip over the tissue section. Avoid trapping air bubbles.
- 5. Repeat steps 2 and 3 for each slide.
- 6. Air dry slides for 5 MIN.
- 7. Proceed to Chapter 6. Evaluate the Results on page 28.





Chapter 6. Evaluate the Results

Examine tissue sections under a standard bright field microscope at 20–40X magnification:

- Assess tissue and cell morphology.
- Assess positive control signal strength. Positive control signal should be visible as punctate dots within the cell at 20–40X magnification.
- Assess negative control background. One dot to every 10 cells displaying background DAB staining per 20X microscope field is acceptable.
- Evaluate target probe signal using the scoring guidelines in the next section.

Scoring guidelines

The RNAscope® 2.5 LSx Assay enables a semi-quantitative scoring guideline utilizing the estimated number of punctate dots present within each cell boundary.

An example of how to develop such a guideline for semi-quantitative assessment of RNAscope $^{@}$ staining intensity is presented below for a gene with expression level varying between 1 to > 10 copies per cell.

Note: If your gene expression level is higher or lower than this range, you may need to scale the criteria accordingly.

Categorize staining into five grades: 0, 1+, 2+, 3+, and 4+ according to the following table:

Staining Score	Microscope Objective Scoring*
0	No staining or less than 1 dot for every 10 cells (40X magnification)
1	1–3 dots/cell (visible at 20–40X magnification)
2	4-10 dots/cell. No or very few dot clusters (visible at 20-40X magnification)
3	>10 dots/cell. Less than 10% positive cells have dot clusters (visible at 20X magnification)
4	>10 dots/cell. More than 10% positive cells have dot clusters (visible at 20X magnification)

^{*} Discount cells with artificially high nuclear background staining.


RNAscope® Spot Studio Software is designed for pathologists with no prior training in image analysis. This intuitive software allows users to get statistical results with complete information of cell-count/region and number of spots/cell. Simply load any image, select a region of interest, define settings, and run the analysis, followed by a quality control review before results are exported.

If the assay is successful, the staining should look like the following image:

Troubleshooting

If you obtain less than satisfactory results, troubleshoot your assay by following these simple guidelines:

- If using over-fixed tissues, increase the Epitope Retrieval 2 (ER2) in increments of five minutes and increase the Enzyme time in increments of five minutes (see **Appendix B. Edit the Protease Protocol** on page 35).
- Do not attempt to refill the pre-filled containers. The 2.5 LSx-RED Reagent Kit contains all necessary reagents including chromogen to run the RNAscope® assay, except for probes. The volumes in the pre-filled containers match the barcodes.
- The BOND Polymer Refine Red Detection reagent is no longer required.
- Pre-filled containers are locked in the trays. Changing the positions of the containers will cause the kit to malfunction.
- Do not shake the contents in the dispensers as this will form bubbles and may lead to weak or no staining. If bubbles are present, leave the containers out at room temperature until the bubbles dissipate.
- Do not alter the staining protocol in any way with the exception of the hematoxylin and bluing
 incubation times. The parameters in the staining protocol are optimized to run the RNAscope® assay
 on the instrument.




Appendix A. Edit the Staining Protocol

Note: When using the RNAscope® 2.5 LSx protocol, you can use the same staining protocol for different probes.


IMPORTANT! We have optimized the RNAscope® 2.5 LSx protocol. Changing the protocol in any way could result in decreased signal strength and increased background level. Deleting critical bond wash steps may also result in suboptimal staining results.

- 1. In the Protocol setup screen, select **Staining** under the Protocol group menu.
- 2. Highlight the *RNAscope 2.5 LSx RED ISH protocol. Select Copy





3. Change the protocol name, the abbreviated name, and the description to reflect any changes made to the protocol.



- 4. Highlight and select the Reagent step to edit it.
- 5. If using software version 4.0, you can change the incubation times, but not the temperature of the steps. If using software version 5.2, you can change both the time and temperature for each step.
- 6. Click **Show wash steps** to view the washing steps found between each reagent. Make sure that **Preferred** is selected (bottom right corner of the window).
- 7. Select Save.
- 8. Click **Next** to proceed. Ignore any pop ups that may appear on the screen.






Create a prestaining protocol

1. Open the Leica BOND software and click on the Protocol setup icon as shown.



- 5. Change the Abbreviated name to LSxE90.
- 6. Change the Description to RNAscope 2.5 LSx heat pretreatment 90C.





7. Highlight the third *Bond ER Solution 2 step. Depending on the tissue type used, change the temperature and time as shown in the following table.





- 6. Highlight the second *RNAscope 2.5 LSx Protease step. Keep the temperature at 40°C and set the enzyme incubation time to 25 MIN.




